



Education in America (CEU EXST 102)

Taught by Professor Daniel Cress and Cindy Mckee

This course will focus on public education in the United States, and will examine how schools function, how the education system is structured, and the reform movements surrounding public education. Participants will have an opportunity to visit with teachers, school administrators, and educational leaders to understand the day-to-day operations of public schools and the responsibilities of educators. We will visit a public high school, middle school, and elementary school and experience what it is like to be an educator and a student in the United States. Other topics that will be investigated include the role of data in decision-making, the pros and cons of standardized testing, and public school funding. The course will be seminar style and will focus on discussion and exploration of relevant education questions.
